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Hello, Miller Alumni and Friends!

We are in a whole new world here at Washburn this spring. The building has been closed since March 17 because of the COVID-19 pandemic, and our whole staff (170 people!) has been at home planning how to continue educating our kids during a global crisis.

"Distance learning" started on Monday, April 6. Most of our students have their own computers at home and are able to participate remotely in both interactive classes and independent work. Our teachers and students have been using online tools like Google Classroom for years, so our students already have familiarity with them.

But about a third of our students do not have computer and internet access at home. The District has been organizing to deliver Chromebooks (the laptops we use in class) to those who have internet access, and paper packets of lessons to those who don't. MPS is also purchasing "hot spots" to help families access the internet, and when those arrive, more Chromebooks will be delivered to families. In the meantime, almost all of our students have smartphones, so many are connecting that way even without a computer.

Our teachers have been awesome about transitioning our lessons online. We are seeing a lot of creativity, intentionality, and persistence throughout this transition. 100% of our teachers made the leap in only three weeks and were ready to go on April 6.They deserve a lot of kudos for that! And almost 80% of our students had connected with their classes by Tuesday, the second day of distance learning. That's incredible.

Our support staff has been busy calling families of students who are not connecting online, to find out how to help get them connected. They are also doing a lot of social-emotional and practical support of families.

Washburn Connects has launched a gift card drive (see page 7) to help support families who are not working and may need help with groceries. If you follow WHS on Facebook, Twitter or Instagram you can also see a great video that we shot as part of #BeTheLightMN for our Class of 2020.

Thank you for your ongoing support of Washburn - we are so grateful to have our alumni always by our sides!

WASHBURN NORDIC TEAM

The Washburn Nordic ski team has seen incredible growth in size over the last few years. In 2019/2020 there were 80 skiers, while 11 years ago there were only four. The team has also grown in terms of the success on and off the ski trail.

This year's Mesabi East Invite (the largest Nordic ski race in North America) was the first time they've had a team place in the top 10 in over 15+ years. All four teams (boys' and girls' Varsity and JV) finished in the top 10 with over 60 teams racing. They also had top three finishes at the ABC Relays for both the boys' and girls' teams, as well as nine individuals on the podium.

For the season overall, they had 11 All-Conference skiers, seven girls and four boys. The girls' team won the Minneapolis Conference for the first time in over 15 years, beating Southwest in a tie-breaker. Both the boys' and girls' teams placed second at Sections. The girls lost the tie-breaker but the boys qualified for State. This was the first time a Washburn Nordic team (as opposed to individuals) qualified in 26 years. The boys' team was made up of: Nico Alexander, Per Alexander, Alex Bion, Zev Breen, Isaac Lowenthal Walsh, Emerson Roy, and Sam Strickland. In addition, we had two individual girls qualify for state, Etta Leugers (third year in a row) and Gillian Bode (first year). Etta finished 23rd at State and received All-State honors.

The teams have also been outstanding in the classroom. Both the boys' and girls' teams received the gold award for academics. This award is given to teams with a 3.75 or higher GPA, and is based on the average of the top five GPAs of the skiers on the Section race team. The boys' team had a 3.77 GPA and the girls' team had a 3.97 GPA!

With tremendous coaching and great support from the skiers' families, we have high hopes for the coming season(s). We hope to see you all at the races!

Julius Caesar, One Act Plays Goes to State

In January, Washburn High School hosted the One Act Play preliminaries for the 5AA Region. The Washburn play was an all-female version of Julius Caesar, set in a women's prison. The cast worked diligently with director John Lynn to understand the material and deliver a compelling version of Shakespeare's classic. The talented cast and crew received a 1st place ranking at preliminaries and sectionals and went on to perform at the state competition at O'Shaughnessy Auditorium on February 7. "Et tu, Brute?"





Jay Mackbee Wins State Poetry Out Loud Competition

Sophomore Jay Mackbee won 1st place in the Minnesota Poetry Out Loud competition in February, after competing against hundreds of other high schoolers across the state. Jay won a \$500 check for books for Washburn, \$250 in cash, and an all-expenses paid trip for two to compete in nationals in Washington, DC, where she will represent Minnesota and perform in the White House for the White House press corps. This is only the third year that Washburn High has competed at Poetry Out Loud. So much Miller talent!

Almost, Maine and Hair

The Theater Department delivered two thought-provoking shows in the 2019/2020 school year. The fall rock musical, Hair, with a cast of 60 students, explored the protests of the 1960s and a nation divided over war. The spring show, Almost, Maine, took place in a mystical town in the northern U.S. where everyone wears flannel and knows each other. The series of 2-3 person scenes all explored different kinds of love, heartache and discovery. The cast delivered heartfelt performances and showed us the power of human connections.
